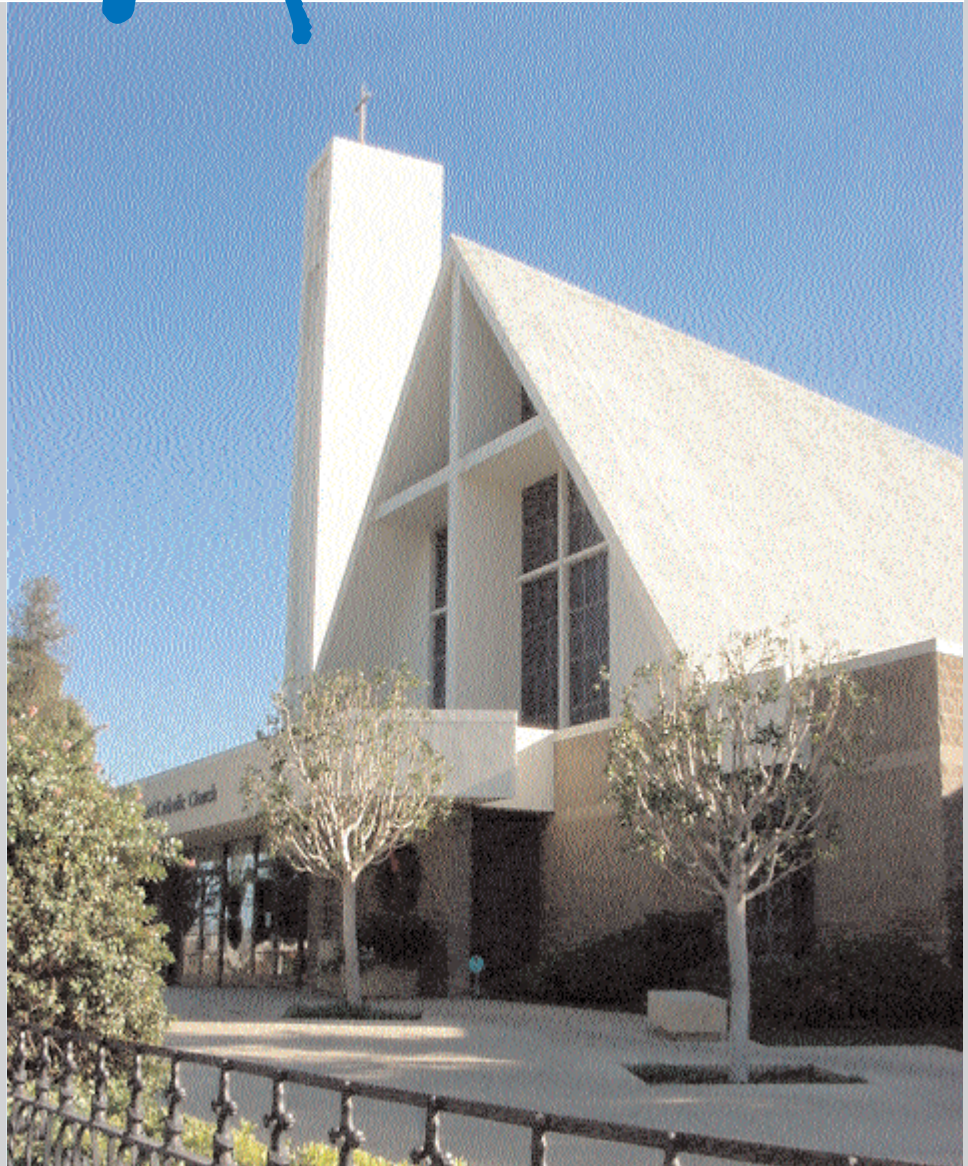

**Pastor's
Corner**
Dear Parish Community of St. Mell

The "Beatitudes" as found in St. Luke's Gospel for today (Luke 6:17, 20-26) are quite different than those in the Gospel of St. Matthew (Matthew 5:3-12). Matthew's Gospel lists nine "Beatitudes" whereas in St. Luke's Gospel we find only four. And the four "Beatitudes" in St. Luke are followed by four "Woes." According to many Scripture scholars, the differences can be traced to the fact that St. Luke's Gospel is directed more toward people who were much better off than the audience of St. Matthew's Gospel. Precisely because they were well off, the people addressed by St. Luke were in danger of pursuing happiness solely in this life. They could be looking for happiness in all the wrong places: fame, fortune, entertainment. Does that sound familiar? Doesn't our society promote these values as means to be happy? And in pursuing these values, we often forget about God and what really matters.

That being said, we still need to understand the "Beatitudes" in St. Luke's Gospel correctly. This Gospel does not glorify poverty, hunger, sadness, or being hated or persecuted. These are real life challenges with which many people struggle. But these situations can be a source of blessing ("beatitude") if we allow them to open us up to God's presence and love, if they teach us to reach out and rely on one another and to appreciate the little we have. People who have worked in what we sometimes almost patronizingly call "Third World" countries return from that experience and marvel at the happiness they have found there. This does not excuse us from reaching out to real and sometimes desperate human needs (food, water, sanitation, health issues, etc.). Nevertheless, what have the poor in the developing countries of our world found that we, with all our advantages so often lack?

Lent begins this coming Ash Wednesday. As in past years, our parish charitable commitment for this Season will be Operation Rice Bowl, sponsored by Catholic Relief Services. As we reach out to people with material needs all over the world, may they, and this Holy Season, teach us to attend to our spiritual needs during this special time.

There is a poem called "A Legend" by Adelaide Proctor. It is about a preacher whose sermons attracted large crowds from far and near. Meanwhile, nearby there was an old man in the background, who was often seen to be quietly plying his rosary beads. One day the preacher was thanking God for his gift of preaching that drew so many listeners, and seemed to change so many lives. Imagine his surprise when a voice told him that it was not his sermons that were having the great effect on people. People's hearts were being touched and changed because of the old man who was praying for others in the background!

Some of the greatest movements for good in the history of the world have been brought about by the quiet prayers of totally unknown people. For every word we speak to others, we should have many words with God. "I go to God for the sake of people, and to people for the sake of God."

Prayer is one of the greatest gifts we can give to one another. It is a gift that comes from the heart, doesn't require special training or expertise, can be given at any time of the day or night, doesn't cost a penny but is priceless! Anyone of any age can give this gift and can receive it! In giving this gift away, the giver grows in his/her relationship with God and with the receiver of the gift. And yet, despite all these benefits, prayer is a ministry within our Church community that is often overlooked.

At this time when we as a parish are looking at stewardship and how we can best offer our time and talents at St. Mel Parish, we can also remember that there is yet another way of offering time and talents. Especially for those who cannot be as actively involved as they would like to be or have been in the past, because of aging or diminished health, we would like to propose a different kind of ministry, the Ministry of Home Prayer. More information about this ministry will be forthcoming in this bulletin column-but in the meantime, think about those you know who might be able to "bless" all of us by participating in this ministry of prayer.

Book Club News: Father Cooley Does It Again! Mitch Albom Next!

The Book Club wishes to thank Father Stephen Cooley, O Carm. for another inspiring evening discussing the issues surrounding Vatican II. We are having fun while learning a lot. Father Cooley returns on St Patrick's Day to complete the VII Series and to help us celebrate our Fifth Anniversary.

The next Book Club Meeting will occur on Ash Wednesday, February 17 at 7 pm in the Parish Center. It will be a discussion of Mitch Albom's "Have a Little Faith". This is the inspiring story of a young man's Faith journey as he observes an older man's challenges. Mitch is asked by an elderly rabbi to write his obituary. To do this, he has to come to know the man and his personal struggles which influence Albom's own journey. This book takes us across societal lines of Christian and Jew, black and white, young and old, impoverished and well-to-do. This is a book about one's life purpose and how Faith changes from belief to an interior life. It asks the question: how well will your Faith endure? Hope to see you.

Moral Decisions III Men's Club Report

Professor Michael Sandel teaches a course at Harvard on Justice. His course aims to help students become more critically minded thinkers about moral decisions. He presents difficult moral dilemmas and asks the students to offer their opinion as to what is the right thing to do. Watching the students, it becomes clear that the assumptions behind our moral reasoning are often contradictory. What is right or wrong is not black and white. Professor Sandel shows how to arrive at a more reasoned decision as to what is the right thing to do. Watching how people respond seems to support the conclusion that "people don't engage in moral reasoning but rather moral rationalization coughed up by some unconscious emotion". In his book "Reclaiming Virtue" John Bradshaw says, "virtues do not arise in us by nature; we are not born with them. Each of us has to work in order to master the virtue or virtues of our choice. Once mastered the virtue becomes a second nature, a new power that habitually enhances our moral performance". You can watch Professor Sandel's class on Justice by going to www.justiceharvard.com. The first class discusses the moral dilemma posed by the runaway trolley discussed in a recent issue of this bulletin.

Right now, to conduct the 2010 census, the U.S. Census Bureau is hiring over 3,000 people to work in three San Fernando Valley offices: Canoga Park, Panorama City, and Burbank. Each of these offices will hire 1,000 workers. In addition, there is a regional office in Northridge.

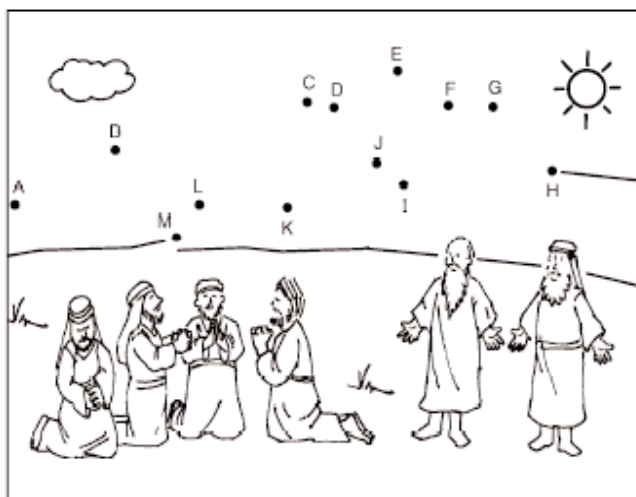
